A culture of filmmaking needs nourishment, guidance and care. DFI provides a space for creative exploration and development and continues to blaze a path led by the vision of establishing an important position in the global narrative for emerging voices and Arab perspectives. An impressive range of 72 projects by filmmakers from around the world were selected through our Grants programme. We also expanded our support of emerging filmmakers with over 35 workshops this year, fostering the creation of 17 short films.

A key platform for discovering exciting voices and compelling perspectives, the ninth edition of DFI's industry incubation event Qumra once again provided emerging and established filmmakers with unprecedented access to accomplished film experts to get their projects off the ground and out to global audiences.

The launch of 'Intaj 2023: Arab World's Cinema' was a particular highlight, paying tribute to Arab cinema pioneers and celebrating the rich cultural heritage of our region.



Doha Film Institute set a few firsts in the Arab region for a film organisation, with its latest projects "About Dry Grasses" by Nuri Bilge Ceylan, Jessica Hausner's "Club Zero" and "Banel E Adama", by Senegalese filmmaker Ramata-Toulaye SY, selected to the prestigious Official Selection, In Competition at the 76th Cannes Film Festival. This nomination makes DFI the only cultural organisation in the MENA region to have eight supported projects including selected for the Official Selection, In Competition to date.

Looking ahead, we remain committed to strengthening the role of Doha Film Institute as a trusted platform for filmmakers across the region and beyond. Our goal is to cultivate the next generation of storytellers who will continue to share authentic perspectives with the world.

I extend my deepest gratitude to our Chair for her continuous support and guidance, the incredible team at DFI for their hard work and dedication, as well as our invaluable private and public sector partners, whose contributions allowed DFI to make meaningful impacts in our society and communities. Their unwavering commitment is the foundation of our continued success.

The Doha Film Institute's workshops and labs are integral to our Training & Development Programme, offering unparalleled opportunities to burgeoning filmmakers. These sessions combine theory, demonstrations, and hands-on exercises to equip participants with the skills and knowledge necessary to excel in all aspects of filmmaking. Led by world-renowned mentors, our programmes are designed to motivate and educate, covering all theoretical and technical facets of the craft.

#### **Comprehensive Filmmaking Training**

#### 'Watching the Classics' with Richard Peña

May 2023 - January 2024

'Watching the Classics' was an online programme during which cinephiles could deepen their knowledge of film history. #### First Cut Lab

June-September 2023

Our online First Cut Lab supported four feature films (fiction/documentary) from Qatar or the MENA region and one short film from Qatar in the editing phase. The primary goal was to enhance the artistic potential of the selected rough cuts while improving their sales, festival, and circulation potential.

Producer/director/editor teams screened their full rough cut and received expert feedback from international film advisors and tailored advice from a consultant editor.



# Transforming the Narrative

Initially scheduled for November 8-16, 2023, the 11th edition of the Ajyal Film Festival was set to continue its legacy of celebrating film, art, and culture. Over the years, Ajyal has become a cornerstone event for the Doha Film Institute (DFI), known for bringing together diverse voices and fostering a vibrant community of filmmakers, artists, and audiences.

This year's festival was poised to feature an array of film screenings, workshops, and interactive events, aiming to inspire and educate attendees while highlighting the transformative power of cinema.

#### A Shift in Focus: From Ajyal to Voices from Palestine

As the date approached, DFI made a significant and heartfelt decision to cancel the Ajyal Film Festival. This was a powerful act of solidarity with the Palestinian community, driven by the ongoing humanitarian crisis and the devastating loss of innocent lives in Palestine.

Instead, DFI chose a poignant repositioning with the launch of "Voices from Palestine: A Film Series," held from November 2 to 9, 2023. This initiative aimed to amplify Palestinian narratives and provide a platform for Palestinian filmmakers to share their stories with a global audience. The series underscored the DFI's commitment to supporting underrepresented voices and ensuring that Palestinian stories, struggles, and resilience were authentically represented and widely heard.

#### **Empowering and Amplifying Palestinian Filmmakers**

The "Voices from Palestine" series showcased a selection of films that depicted various facets of Palestinian life and history. These films, created by talented Palestinian filmmakers, offered audiences a deep and nuanced understanding of the Palestinian experience. The screenings took place at Katara Building 16, Drama Theatre, each followed by discussions that allowed for further engagement and reflection.

#### The Time That Remains - Elia Suleiman

 A semi-autobiographical film tracing the history of Palestine from 1948 to the present through the lens of Suleiman's family.

#### My Love Awaits Me by the Sea - Mais Darwazah

 A poetic journey through memory and loss, exploring themes of love and hope amidst the turmoil of Palestine.

#### Divine Intervention - Elia Suleiman

 A compellingly layered film blending reality and absurdity to depict life under occupation.

#### 3000 Nights - Mai Masri

 A poignant narrative about a Palestinian woman giving birth in an Israeli prison and raising her son behind bars.

#### The Roof - Kamal Aljafari

 A documentary exploring the filmmaker's family's lives under occupation, portraying the enduring spirit of the Palestinian people.

#### Dégradé - Arab Nasser and Tarzan Nasser

 A gripping drama set in a Gaza beauty salon, reflecting the tensions and struggles of life in the besieged territory.

#### Little Palestine: Diary of a Siege - Abdallah Al Khatib

 A documentary capturing the harsh realities of life in the Yarmouk refugee camp during the Syrian conflict.

#### 200 Meters - Ameen Nayfeh

 A touching story about a Palestinian father who must cross the separation wall to reach his hospitalized son, illustrating the physical and emotional barriers imposed by occupation.

#### Wajib - Annemarie Jacir

 A drama about a father and son navigating familial and societal expectations in Nazareth.

#### Standing in Solidarity Through Cinema

The timely transition from Ajyal 2023 to "Voices from Palestine" demonstrated DFI's deep empathy and unwavering support for the Palestinian cause. By turning the focus towards Palestinian filmmakers and their compelling narratives, DFI not only honoured its commitment to social justice and cultural representation but also highlighted the enduring power of cinema to advocate for change and solidarity.









#### Historic Highlights from Arab Cinema's Rich Legacy

In 2023, DFI proudly presented Intaj 2023: Arab World's Cinema, a comprehensive multimedia exhibition held from 10 November 2023 to 10 February 2024 at Sikkat Wadi Msheireb. This exhibition paid homage to the founders and pioneers of Arab cinema and showcased the rich and diverse history of the industry across the region.





#### Pioneers and Visionaries —The Evolution of Arab Film

Intaj 2023 aimed to illuminate the complex tapestry of stories woven by Arab filmmakers, from the early 20th century to the present day. It chronicled the contributions of early pioneers like The Lama Brothers, Al Taher Hannash, Togo Mizrahi, and Albert Samama-Chikli from Palestine, Egypt, Tunisia, and Algeria, and highlighted the transformative period between the 1940s and the 1970s.

The exhibition also featured the innovative and experimental approaches of contemporary Arab filmmakers who are reshaping the narrative and challenging stereotypes. By doing so, Intaj 2023 underscored DFI's commitment to authentic representation and the empowerment of independent voices from the Arab world.



#### **Local Artistic Contributions**

It offered a range of activities, including industry talks, film screenings centred around Palestine, and a curated selection of timeless classics from the top 100 Arab films of all time. 


# Geekend 2023




# Film Screenings


